This Administrative Order applies to all cases brought pursuant to Part V of Chapter 394 of the Florida Statutes, specifically Florida Statutes §§ 394.910 - 394.931, entitled as the “Involuntary Commitment of Sexually Violent Predators Act,” and more commonly known as the “Jimmy Ryce Act.”


All Jimmy Ryce cases shall be assigned randomly to a judge of the civil division upon filing. Upon the filing by the State Attorney of a Petition for Commitment of any individual pursuant to the Jimmy Ryce Act, the State Attorney shall present to the assigned judge, or in his or her absence, to the Duty Judge on call at the time, an ex parte motion and order for probable cause determination. At that time, the State Attorney will also file proposed motions and orders for detention of the Respondent, transportation of the Respondent, appointment of the Public Defender and a blank order setting a trial date.

The petition, motions and orders shall be presented to the assigned judge, or in his or her absence, to the Duty Judge on call, for his or her review. In the event that the Duty Judge signs the orders, the file will thereafter be transmitted directly to the assigned judge in the civil division for signature of the trial order. The trial order must set a trial date within thirty (30) days of presentation of the file to the Court as provided by Florida Statute § 394.916
