WHEREAS, the Florida Supreme Court issued an opinion on April 5, 2007, In re Amendments to Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2,420 - Sealing of Court Records and Dockets, 954 So. 2d 16 (Fla. 2007); and

WHEREAS, in the opinion, the Florida Supreme Court amended Fla. R. Jud. Admin. 2.420 so as to create a new subdivision setting forth specific procedures governing requests to make circuit and county court records in noncriminal cases confidential; and

WHEREAS, in the opinion, the Florida Supreme Court provided that the amendments would become effective immediately upon issuance of the opinion and would supercede any conflicting procedures established by local administrative orders; and

WHEREAS, local Administrative Order 2.29 is not fully consistent with the amendments to Fla. R. Jud. Admin. 2.420, and, in light of the amendments to Fla. R. Jud. Admin. 2.420, is no longer necessary;

IT IS ORDERED, by the authority vested in the Chief Judge pursuant to Fla. R. Jud. Admin. 2.215, that Administrative Order 2.29 is hereby VACATED.
