ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
NO: 2.6

Pursuant to Fla. R. Jud. Admin. 2.050(b)(2) and (e)(3), the Twentieth Judicial Circuit hereby creates the Administrative Code for use within the Twentieth Judicial Circuit in accordance with the authority provided within each Administrative Order.


A complete copy of all currently effective Administrative Orders and Local Rules shall be maintained by the Court Administrator for the Twentieth Judicial Circuit. All Administrative Orders designated as such by the Chief Judge shall be indexed and recorded by the Clerks of the Circuit Court in each county where the Orders are effective as provided in Fla. R. Jud. Admin. 2.050(e)(3).

While all Judges are free to operate their courtrooms as they see fit within the Constitution and laws of the United States and the State of Florida, all previously executed and recorded Orders, no matter how they are designated, are hereby rescinded, revoked and repealed. Only the Administrative Code as designated by the Chief Judge shall govern the practice and procedure within the Twentieth Judicial Circuit as a whole.
