WHEREAS, Rule 2.055 of the Florida Rules of Judicial Administration requires that all pleadings, motions, petitions, briefs, notices, orders, judgments, decrees, opinions, and other papers and official documents filed in any court shall be on paper measuring 8 1/2 by 11 inches; it is therefore


ORDERED that subsequent to January 1, 1991, the Clerks of the Twentieth Judicial Circuit shall comply with Rule 2.055.

When time of filing is critical, the Clerk shall accept pleadings, motions, petitions, briefs, notices, orders, judgments, decrees, opinions, or other papers or official documents on other than 8 1/2 by 11 inch paper but shall then require that the document be resubmitted to comply with the Rule.

Xerographic reduction of legal-size (8 1/2 by 14 inches) documents to letter size (8 1/2 by 11 inches) is prohibited.

Any exhibit or attachment filed with pleadings or papers may be filed in its original size.
