# **Open & Approval of Previous Minutes**

# **Honorable Judge Tara Paluck**

- The meeting was called to order was at 12:00 p.m. by the Honorable Judge Tara Paluck
- Meeting Minutes from December 11, 2018 stand as approved with some changes to names and titles.

# Item 1) Jail Population Update

#### Sgt. Travis Allen, LCSO

- When comparing the jail population numbers in 2018 with the year so far, the numbers have increased.
  - Jail numbers have increased 20%
  - Core numbers have increased 16%
  - o CPU numbers have increased 18%
- Past numbers indicate a decline during spring break
- Numbers start to climb the during the summer season

# Item 2) Treatment Courts Update

#### Stacy Stiens, AOC Treatment Courts Manager

- Drug Court 125 active participants
  - o 55% success rate
  - 60 day average from referral to entry
- Mental Health Court 42 active participants
  - 71% success rate
  - 38 day average from referral to entry
- Veteran's Court
  - 16 active participants
  - o 73% success rate
  - 60-65 day average from referral to entry
- Specialty Treatment Court targets non-violent felonies.
- DCCM Software funded by OSCA now being fully utilized.
- Thermo Fischer Testing through AIM Target tests for 13 different substances with minimal lab confirmations
- TLS handles treatment, case management and aftercare.
- Areas of improvement needed are more funding opportunities and statistics on six months, one year and 18 months recidivism rates.

# Item 3) Assisted/Involuntary Outpatient Program (AOT)

#### Daleen O'Dell, Family Member for Community Based Treatment

- 8.3 million people have been diagnosed with schizophrenia or bipolar disorder
- 2.8 million people remain untreated

- 50% of murders committed are by people with mental health issues who are not on medication or receiving treatment.
- AOT has been shown to reduce hospitalization, arrest and incarceration, homelessness and violent acts associated with mental illness.
- AOT is a level of care under the Baker Act.
- Seminole County was the first county in Florida to establish AOT treatment.
- AOT is endorsed by:
  - International Association of Chiefs of Police
  - National Sheriffs' Association
  - Department of Justice
  - o American Psychiatric Association

- The Homeless Coalition website: LeeHomeless.org will be up for a 30 day period to voice any comments or suggestions/ideas.

# Item 4) Marsy's Law

# Paul Poland, State Attorney's Office

- Marsy's Law (Rights of Crime Victims) went into effect January 8, 2019.
- We have started discussions on how it relates to us.
- Senate Bill 1426
- There has been no committee formed yet.
- LCSO working on changing charging documents, i.e., locations and addresses of victims will be omitted. Witness lists will no longer be going to the Clerk with disclaimer.
- Public records and Litigation letters will be going to all victims with copy of Marsy's Law for further information.
- 1<sup>st</sup> Appearance Orders, looking into process of making them confidential when requested by victim, may need to make no contact orders confidential.
- Speedy Trial requests will occur occasionally at the victim's request.
- Pretrial Intake Dept. can be contacted 24/7 by law enforcement for any information that needs to be related to the 1<sup>st</sup> Appearance Judge.
- Appreciation for the Public Defender and State Attorney's Office working together.
- This law has good intentions but we need guidance on how we should be proceeding.
